


## Sunday Afternoon Carpool Plan

Student safety is the primary concern of PREP staff and volunteers during carpool. The Archdiocese of Atlanta and Transfiguration have established a plan for the safe dismissal of students from PREP classes. It is specifically designed to keep people out of the path of moving traffic. **This is the only approved method for picking up students, and everyone is expected to adhere to it.** Parents who tell their children to meet them at another church entrance, in the church foyer, or at a classroom are in violation of the safety procedures mandated by the Archdiocese. This also sets a poor example for the students, teaching them to disregard established policies. Anyone with reservations about using this carpool system should contact the pastor of Transfiguration.

**It is the parents' responsibility to notify the PREP office staff of any individuals who are NOT allowed to sign out or pick up their child(ren).**

During carpool, catechists will accompany their class to the loading area, monitor student behavior, and stay with their class until all students from the class have been picked up.

- If your student is attending 6:00 pm Mass, please meet them in the Church foyer.
- Students will be dismissed in front of the entrance to the Bishop Hall.
- Parents must enter the church parking lot using the driveway adjacent to the Parish guest house. NOTE: Other drivers will be entering the parking lot at the same time to attend the 6:00 pm Mass.
- Drivers should proceed according to the directional arrows on the diagram.
- When drivers follow the directions of carpool volunteers, 5 cars can be loaded at one time. It is extremely dangerous to pass other vehicles in the loading zone. Such carelessness will not be tolerated.
- Drivers should use extreme caution when exiting the parking lot – pedestrians are on their way to Mass.



**PLEASE** respect and follow directions given by our carpool VOLUNTEERS!  
When their directions are followed, carpool runs much quicker, smoother and is safer for all involved.
