## Ignatian Spirituality Project (ISP) Spiritual Retreats Ending Homelessness

The Ignatian spirituality Project (ISP) is a nationwide ministry sponsored by the Jesuits to give spiritual retreats to homeless men and homeless women in recovery (see [www.ignatianspiritualityproject.org](http://www.ignatianspiritualityproject.org)).



This is an active ministry in our Atlanta diocese which is carried out with volunteers and in collaboration with Ignatius House. Overnight retreats are offered four times a year and days of recollection are also offered 4 times a year separately for men and women.



The ministry relies on volunteers to:

Help facilitate retreats assisted by a well-planned agenda

Provide transportation for the retreatants between the Sandy Springs MARTA station and Ignatius House. (10 minutes)

Prepare “goody bags” (hygiene articles etc.) for the participants (12-16 people)

Provide bag lunches for 12-16 people at the conclusion of the overnight retreat.

Make prayer shawls for the participants

The Women’s retreats have a special need at this time for drivers for Ignatius House.
