Vincent de Paul was the son of French peasants. He went to college and became a priest. Once, when he was traveling, he was captured and sold as a slave in Algeria. It was two years before he could escape. Vincent spent the rest of his life working for the poor. He built hospitals and orphanages and he ransomed Christian slaves in Africa. Today, St.

Vincent de Paul Societies around the world still work to help the poor.
